More Artists To Visit 91.7 WEEM-FM

91.7 WEEM, in association with the Rock For Riley Showcase Series—a chain of benefit concerts to raise money for Riley Children’s Hospital, My Old Kentucky Blog, and MusicalFamilyTree.com, will welcome two more high profile artists to the 91.7 WEEM studios at Pendleton Heights High School.

The Whigs will record an in-studio session on Monday, April 9, at 2 p.m. before their “Rock For Riley” benefit show in Indianapolis later that evening. The Whigs are a garage-pop band with a retro edge from Athens, Georgia. They are signed to ATO Records, a division of RCA that was co-founded by Dave Matthews in 2000.

Singer/songwriter Josh Rouse will visit PHHS on Monday, April 16, at 2:30 p.m. before his “Rock For Riley” benefit concert in Indianapolis. Rouse was raised in Nebraska and spent a couple years in Nashville before moving to Spain in 2004. He has released a flurry of critically praised pop/rock albums and EP’s.
